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AT A GLANCE

Growing up can be tough in the best of circumstances. I was just five when, for one year, I became the only girl in an all-boys' school – of which my dad was the headteacher. Let's just say, it wasn't the easiest way to blend in!

Children and young people in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) are navigating all the typical challenges of youth, like body image, peer pressure, friendships and relationships. But they also endure added burdens that no child should have to experience: war, early marriage, poverty, lack of schooling, and even persecution.

This is the context into which SAT-7 broadcasts – speaking God's love to young hearts amid both life's daily hurdles and its deepest hardships. Among these young viewers is a boy named Jad from Syria. Kidnapped by militants at the age of just 11, it was the songs he had learnt on SAT-7 KIDS that carried him through. "Even when I was kidnapped," he said, "I used to remember the songs. I used to sing them again and again." Turn to p6 to read about Jad's lifelong journey with SAT-7.

And Jad's story is just one glimpse of God at work through SAT-7. A HEAVENLY HERO

HOW GOD TURNED MY CHILDHOOD PAIN INTO PURPOSE

Sometimes I wonder how I made it through. A little girl, growing up in Lebanon's civil war, holding on to a dream, a hope, a future, blurred by the sounds of gunfire and the weight of hatred.

I grew up in a Christian family in Lebanon in the 1970s. My mum passed away when I was five and my sister was seven. My dad was part of the militia, fighting for what he believed in.

As a child, I saw things no child should ever see. I saw people killed right in front of me. I remember how often we had to run, moving from one shelter to another, trying to escape soldiers who targeted people just because of what they believed.

And honestly, I don't remember feeling scared all the time. Maybe my memory has softened, or maybe I blocked parts of it out. But I do remember this: when

my dad was at home, I felt safe. My dad was my hero, my everything. In my little world, heroes didn't die. They were always there, standing tall, protecting their little girls.

But when he went off to fight, the nights became heavy. I would lie there, heart racing – afraid that this time, my hero wouldn't come back.

My safe space was the television. That little screen became my escape. I loved superheroes because they reminded me of my dad. I was drawn to characters like Jack the Giant Killer, Wonder Woman and Superman.

I would stand in front of the mirror for hours, acting out scenes, sometimes even performing in front of a static television, imagining an audience watching me. But of course, that little world didn't last forever.

When puberty arrived, reality hit hard. I started realising that I wasn't the hero I had pretended to be. I was just watching from the sidelines. That's when the questions began to pour in. Who am I? Why am I here? What's my purpose?

I was desperate for answers and kept telling myself, when I turn 18,

everything will change. But thankfully, something much bigger happened before I reached that age.

Nothing outside changed. It was the same small house, same war, same shelters, same worn-out clothes. But inside, everything shifted.

I met a new hero, a Heavenly Father. A God whose love overwhelmed me and spoke to my heart. His Word told me: “For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future” (Jeremiah 29:11).

Some people try to forget their childhood trauma. Not me. I never want to forget. Yes, God healed me, and yes, I learned to forgive. But I want to remember, so that when I meet someone walking through what I once walked through, I can offer the love, the peace, and the comfort God gave me.

Coming from a small country, one

many people don't even know exists, I needed a way to share my story. I wanted to tell others who were hurting just like I had that there is hope, there is a way, and we can face it together, even if we are different.

That's what SAT-7 became for me. It gave me a space where I could take my story, my pain, and my healing and turn it into something living, something that speaks right into the hearts of children today – kids who are going through the same fears and losses I once lived.

With SAT-7 KIDS, I'm part of a team creating programmes filled with laughter, creativity, and deep faith, always praying they will touch children's lives in a lasting way.

I think of Hagar, a young Kurdish girl who fled the war in Syria. She found her way to SAT-7 KIDS, first through a game show, and later through a short film we produced about her life. Her journey, her strength, and her faith moved all of us. I remember her saying, “Jesus makes my dreams come true.” That kind of moment stays with you and reminds me every day why this work matters.

But it's not just the big stories. It's the small, quiet moments that shine.

Like Angela, a little girl who called in during a live show asking for prayer before her school exam. The presenters stopped everything and prayed with her. A week later, she called back, joyful and excited, celebrating that she got full marks on her test. These are the moments where children feel heard, seen, and lifted up. And they are the quiet miracles that happen every week.

That's the beauty of SAT-7 KIDS. We don't just create programmes that bring hope. We create a loving, interactive space where children feel valued and supported.

Whether they come from Christian families or non-Christian backgrounds, the heart of what we do is the same. We help them meet Jesus, not as a distant figure, but as a loving friend who is always near and always listening.

I'm no longer that little girl sitting in front of the TV, waiting and longing for her hero to come home. Now, I get to stand on the other side, helping bring the love and peace I found – the love that saved me – to children across the Middle East and North Africa.

And that gives me hope for the future, because even in the hardest places, God's love can reach a child's heart and change everything.

Together, we can keep showing children across this region that they are seen, they are loved, and they are never, ever alone.

"I NEVER STOPPED WATCHING"

JAD'S LIFELONG JOURNEY WITH SAT-7

Many of our viewers grow up watching SAT-7 from a young age, and – thanks to your faithful support – we have had the privilege of watching them grow in their relationship with God over many years. For those whose families aren't Christians, SAT-7's children's shows are often their first introduction to the good news of Jesus.

One young viewer who discovered SAT-7 at a young age is Jad from Syria. When we first heard from Jad, he was watching our programmes in secret and longing for the day when he could get baptised and attend a local church safely. Through years of violence and change in Syria, SAT-7 has been there for Jad, strengthening his faith and supporting him in his trials.

"I USED TO REMEMBER THE SONGS"

Jad was 17 years old when he first contacted us in 2021. We were delighted to hear that, since the age of around ten, he had been watching SAT-7 and had grown to know and love God through our programmes. Marianne Awaraji, a long-time SAT-7 presenter who was in contact with Jad

at the time, asked how he was affected by the violence around him.

"When the war started, everything changed," Jad said. "I left my house; I left my region; I was far from my siblings and away from my dad." He even recalled two harrowing experiences: when his father survived a murder attempt, and when he himself was kidnapped.

One of the things that helped Jad to deal with these traumatic events was

the music he had memorised from SAT-7 KIDS' programmes. "Even when I was kidnapped," he said, "I used to remember the songs. I used to sing them again and again."

Jad shared that, despite his family not knowing about his faith, his dream was to be baptised. It was a prayer that God was willing to answer. Three years after Marianne's first contact with Jad, in December 2024, she heard from him again...

"I HAVE BEEN BAPTISED!"

"Hi, I hope you remember me," Jad's message to Marianne began. "Today is my big day, because I have been baptised! All of this was thanks to you. You were like a lighthouse for me, lighting the way and guiding me to Jesus!"

Jad's prayers were answered in full: since his first contact with SAT-7, he had told his family about his faith and found a vibrant Christian community. "I'm going to a wonderful church, and I feel like I'm at home there," he said. "I have amazing friends; they're all supportive and loving."

"I never stopped watching you," he told Marianne. "The day before my baptism, I was watching your programme where you talked about the work of the Holy Spirit... You can't imagine how much that episode changed me. I really love SAT-7."

But just days after Jad's call to SAT-7, events in Syria were about to take an unexpected turn.

"WE CAN SEE THE HAND OF GOD"

In December 2024, after 13 years of war in Syria, President Bashar al-Assad was suddenly overthrown by Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS). The dramatic fall of the Assad regime was a cause for great celebration for many people in Syria and beyond.

But there is also much uncertainty regarding the country's new leaders and what their rule will mean for Syria's minorities, including Christians. A suicide bombing at a Damascus church in June sent shockwaves through the Syrian Christian community, and brought into question their ongoing safety. We got in touch with Jad again

to find out what his life is like now.

"Unfortunately, most Syrians are afraid," Jad shared. "Christians are afraid of tomorrow. They are afraid of what will happen. But our Father in heaven cares for us and this is our biggest pride. We are not afraid of persecution; we are proud of our Christianity. We can see the hand of God. We thank God churches are open, and [that] we gather in worship."

"THE BASIS OF MY FAITH"

Despite the turbulent events that have marked Jad's life so far and uncertainty about his future in Syria, it is clear that his faith is maturing, and that SAT-7 has been pivotal in his journey. "Honestly, SAT-7 is in our hearts," Jad shared. "It is the basis of my faith. It built my faith. It supported me... When I was a child I watched SAT-7 KIDS and as I have grown up, I now watch SAT-7 ARABIC."

As for Marianne, who has supported Jad since his first call in 2014, she has been deeply encouraged to witness the growth in Jad's faith – and the faith of thousands of other children and young people – over the years.

"Jad's story reminds us that even in the most challenging circumstances, God's light can shine brightly through SAT-7," she observed. "What began as a secret seed of faith planted through our programmes in his little heart has blossomed into a bold and open declaration of Jesus as Lord."

SAT-7 PROMOTES OPPORTUNITY FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES

in the integration process of their child because the more they persist, the less resistance there will be from society and the more acceptance of their child. This is important for their child's wellbeing.”

TOYA'S STORY

One particularly poignant episode sees the parents of Toya, who was born blind, describe their journey trying to get their daughter accepted into a mainstream school. Mary, Toya's mother, shared: “Every child is beautiful and has unique talents, but you must know how to discover them.” They eventually found a school that accepted Toya, a school where she is now thriving and has made lots of friends.

Mary reflected on her faith in God's steadfastness despite the difficulties her daughter faced, saying: “From day one I knew there would be many difficulties on the way, but that God would always prepare people and places for the sake of Toya in a beautiful way.” Mary concluded by sharing her advice to other parents going through a similar experience: “Love your children and accept them, so that they will accept themselves, [because] when they accept themselves as they are, then they can conquer the world.”

Children with disabilities in the Middle East and North Africa often face isolation and exclusion. SAT-7 has been challenging the status quo and supporting families to help their children achieve their potential through Arabic programme *The Same Bench*.

UNICEF estimates that one in seven children in the region – nearly 21 million – have a disability. This is why disability is a key priority within the UN's Sustainable Development Goals, specifically in relation to education. While mainstream schools are required to integrate pupils with disabilities, many do not, for several reasons including a lack of resources necessary to accommodate children with additional needs.

“We saw a need in the media to address specific issues affecting the education of children with special needs in mainstream schools and what challenges they and their parents face in the process,” programme producer Tamer Adly said.

ENCOURAGING ACCEPTANCE

Topics covered on the programme include transport for children with disabilities, success stories, autism, and prejudice against children with disabilities.

Each episode opens with a short drama about a difficulty a teacher is facing regarding a child with a disability. The same teacher is then seen sitting with an expert discussing the issue and receiving advice on how to handle it.

“It is necessary that the school management and teachers accept students with disabilities, because other students don't judge students with disabilities unless they see an adult doing so,” said Nadia Abdullah, a family rehabilitation consultant at CARITAS Egypt.

She encourages parents of children with disabilities to apply for their children to go to mainstream schools, because it helps to boost their potential, it encourages them to challenge themselves, and they don't feel different from other students. Nadia gave an example of how the father of a blind girl insisted she join a mainstream school. After many rejections, a school finally accepted her. She rose to the top of her class, passed her exams with the highest grades, and entered university.

SUPPORTING PARENTS

The Same Bench has been raising awareness about disability issues and challenging misconceptions. The programme also educates and encourages families who have a child with a disability by highlighting their rights and providing guidance on how best to support their child to achieve their potential.

Maha Badawy, an expert on childhood and adolescence, told *The Same Bench*:

“Parents need to be prepared to face opposition from society in the form of looks and alienation, but they must persist

7 WAYS TO PRAY

FOR CHILDREN

IN THE MIDDLE EAST

1 GODLY GUIDANCE

Young people in the MENA are facing monumental political and social challenges. But they are also navigating all the normal troubles of adolescence – body image, friendships, peer pressure, hormones, parents, exams, dating and relationships. **Amidst the confusion of youth, pray for young people to seek out wisdom and to find godly advice and Christian role models through SAT-7.**

2 A SPIRIT OF COURAGE

Many children in the MENA grow up in countries which are hostile to the Christian faith, where believers tend to be a tiny minority. **Pray for young non-Christians, that they will have the courage to start to question their inherited beliefs and seek after the truth.** Pray too for young Christians growing up in the MENA, that they will have the courage to take a stand for Christ, even when it comes at a cost.

3 OPPORTUNITIES TO LEARN

At least 30 million children in the MENA are out of school, and a lack of education can limit future opportunities for work. **Pray urgently for provision of schooling, particularly for girls, who are unfairly denied an education in many countries of the region including Afghanistan.** Praise God that, even when school access is limited, children have the opportunity to learn through SAT-7's educational programmes like *Sun of Hope* and *My School*.

“Our inboxes [are] filled with deeply personal struggles... with loneliness, depression, addiction, anxiety, fear of death, bullying, identity crises, and heartbreak. Some asked about Jesus. Others wrestled with guilt or regret. Many simply longed to be understood. And we were there to listen.”

4 A SENSE OF VALUE

Like all young people, those in the MENA need to know their inherent worth and value to their Creator God. For girls in particular, cultural and religious practices in the region can leave them feeling worthless. **Pray that, through SAT-7's programmes, both boys and girls will see themselves through God's eyes as His beloved children.**

5 CHANCES TO PLAY

Play shouldn't be an optional extra in childhood – it is foundational to development and is enshrined in human rights. Yet many children in the MENA are denied the right to play. **Pray God's blessing over SAT-7 children's shows like *La Fiesta*, *Golpand* and *Challenge Accepted*, which are full of music, creativity, fun and games.** Pray that, through the playfulness of these programmes, young viewers will encounter the joy of the Lord.

6 HOPE FOR THE FUTURE

Climate change, technological encroachment, never-ending conflicts... For today's younger generation, not just in the MENA but around the world, the future can seem increasingly bleak. **Pray that the region's young people will put their hope in Christ, and trust Him for their future.** Give thanks that SAT-7's programmes are making the hope of the Gospel available to children in their own languages – like *Children of Light*, a new children's programme in Tamazight, a language spoken in Morocco.
